

Medical Toxicologist Faculty Position

The ideal candidate for this position will be BC/BE in Medical Toxicology. Excellence in clinical service and teaching of medical students, residents and fellows is an expectation.

The Division of Toxicology works closely with the [Central Ohio Poison Center](#) (COPC) to provide state-of-the-art poison prevention, assessment and treatment advice for 64 of Ohio's 88 counties. The COPC is located on the campus of Nationwide Children's Hospital and has 24-hour medical back-up by the Division.

In addition to the COPC, the Division of Toxicology has an active consult service at Nationwide Children's Hospital.

Nationwide Children's Hospital also has an active research program; our team has recent publications on the epidemiology of new poisoning hazards. Institutional research resources are excellent.
